



William James Dunlop Award

The William James Dunlop Award was instituted by The Heritage Lodge No. 730 in 1985 to recognize the outstanding and continuing contribution by a Freemason to the Craft in Ontario. The Award is named in honour of M. W. Bro. William James Dunlop (1881-1961) who served as Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario in 1937-1938. Dr. Dunlop was an eminent educator, and Member of the Ontario Legislature, where he served as Minister of Education (1951-1959).

The recipient may or may not be a member of The Heritage Lodge. Only one award is given in any calendar year. Nominations for this prestigious award should be sent to the Secretary of The Heritage Lodge, either by post or e-mail, on or before November 15th for consideration by the Awards Committee. The recipient will be announced and the award presented at the Annual Black-tie Dinner of the Lodge.
